# FROM DIRECTOR OF INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT CHRIS HALEY

WE ARE INCREDIBLY GRATEFUL TO EACH of the 528 parents, grandparents, alumni, trustees, faculty, staff, administrators, foundations, and friends who contributed nearly \$1.043 million to Professional Children's School during the 2015-2016 academic year.

2015-2016 was an incredible year for PCS. Donors provided more than \$425,000 toward tuition & financial aid for deserving students, many of whom would not have been able to attend PCS without donor support.

In 2015-2016, PCS awarded funding to seven students from the Dr. James Dawson Fund for Broadway Scholars, totalling more than \$88,000. Next year, we will award another eight Dawson Fund scholarships providing an additional \$98,000. The success of the Dawson Fund inspired the creation of additional targeted scholarship funds, including the SAPAR Contemporary Art Scholarship Fund, which provides full scholarship support to a qualified student in the visual arts.

Similarly, our generous alumna Nancy Malone, who sadly passed away in May of 2014, provided significant support from her estate to her existing PCS scholarship fund for students in the dramatic arts.

In addition, we successfully concluded our campaign for the Second Century STEM Initiative (SCSI), raising more than \$300,000 to enhance PCS's STEM education. The SCSI has enabled PCS to make numerous exciting science, technology, engineering, and math-related enhancements to our classrooms and labs. On February 29, 2016, nearly 150 supporters and 25 students participated in Legacies: A Cabaret Benefit, our annual gala benefit, which netted more than \$85,000 toward student financial aid (the equivalent of two full PCS scholarships). Additionally, we presented the newlyestablished PCS Legacy Award to distinguished alumni Robbie Fairchild, Jessie Baylin, and Arlene Shuler, and retiring, long-time staff member Peggy Meertins.

Our supporters did all of the above while generously contributing more than \$300,000 toward PCS's unrestricted Annual Fund, which helps to underwrite the school's general operation.

In addition to fundraising, the Advancement Office is responsible for our alumni relations efforts. We are excited to welcome long-time PCS administrator Dania Nauholnyk to the Advancement team on a part-time basis, who in July 2016 began serving as PCS's Alumni Liaison, in addition to her duties as Dean of Middle School Life. Dania will be working closely with our Alumni Association Council to provide expanded outreach to our vibrant, growing alumni community.

We are also thrilled to welcome Noël Soisson — seen with me in the photo above — who joined the Advancement team in the fall of 2015. Among Noël's many contributions to our Advancement efforts, she has brought new life and creativity to our various digital communications. We are very fortunate to have both Dania and Noël working with the Advancement Office.

We invite you to stop by our office to say hello. The Advancement Office is located on the third floor at 132 West 60th Street. All PCS supporters and alumni are warmly encouraged to drop by anytime the school is open.


# SECOND CENTURY STEM INITIATIVE


Annual Fund contributors have invested more than \$300,000 toward PCS's Second Century STEM Initiative (SCSI), more than \$50,000 beyond our original goal. The SCSI was created in 2014 to strengthen and deepen our academic offerings in the areas of science, technology, engineering, and math in ways that benefit all students regardless of their current or future careers.

The Second Century STEM Initiative is focused on the following five areas:

- 1. Faculty Professional Development
- 2. Classroom Equipment Upgrades
- Beyond the Classroom Enrichment for Students
- 4. Investment in Technology
- 5. Distinguished Visitor Series

As of the summer of 2016, PCS has invested more than \$70,000 toward state of the art classroom and laboratory equipment and technology upgrades, including the purchase of new optical dissecting microscopes for Middle and Upper School biology and environmental science labs, along with DNA electrophoresis equipment, invertebrate and vertebrate dissection specimens, and new chemistry lab equipment, including beakers and digital thermometers. We have also incorporated numerous elements of a fabrication lab into our existing Middle and Upper School classroom spaces, which will be introduced to students in the fall of 2016. Also in the summer of 2016, we converted an entire classroom into a new Upper School physics lab. These are but a few of the many enhancements that have






been made possible by funding from SCSI donors.

Additionally, PCS has invested nearly \$40,000 for our STEM faculty to attend national and regional conferences and other trainings to expand and enhance their knowledge base for classroom instruction. The school has invested an additional \$1,500 toward subscriptions for STEM-related scholarly publications and faculty participation in professional associations.


In the 2016-2017 school year, the PCS STEM program will focus its efforts on expanding the school's Beyond the Classroom Enrichment offerings and implementing a Distinguished Visitor Series.

# BANNER YEAR FOR TUITION & FINANCIAL AID SUPPORT

2015-2016 has been a banner year for financial aid support for students. Generous contributions to The Dr. James Dawson Fund for Broadway Scholars, the SAPAR Contemporary Art Scholarship Fund, the Nancy Malone Scholarship Fund, the Carol Kleban Tuition & Financial Aid Fund, and the PCS Tuition & Financial Aid Fund have enabled PCS to provide more than \$1.04 million in tuition assistance in the 2015-2016 school year.







# THE DR. JAMES DAWSON FUND FOR BROADWAY SCHOLARS

Created in 2014 to commemorate Dr. Dawson's 20th year as Head of School, the Dawson Fund for Broadway Scholars has raised more than \$425,000 to make PCS more affordable for students from the Broadway community. During the 2015-2016 school year, seven scholarships totaling \$88,300 were awarded from The Dawson Fund, and in 2016-2017, eight students will receive a combined total of \$98,000 from The Fund. In the 2015-2016 year alone, PCS had students from Matilda, She Loves Me, The King and I, and Finding Neverland. We are grateful to our many benefactors who continue to generously support this important fund, which reinforces our school's proud heritage.

# SENIOR CLASS GIFT FUND

# NAMED & RESTRICTED FUNDS

### THE BOB AVIAN SCHOLARSHIP (ESTABLISHED IN 1997)

Sir Cameron Macintosh established this endowed scholarship fund to honor his friend and colleague, producer/choreographer Bob Avian. The scholarship is awarded to a PCS student with an interest in the field of dance and is based on academic and artistic merit.

### CENTENNIAL FUND FOR THE FUTURE (ESTABLISHED IN 2012)

The Centennial Fund for the Future was created by the PCS Board of Trustees to raise funds toward paying off the School's IDA Bond.

### THE DANI BRENNER '96 DARE TO DREAM FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2010)

The Dani Brenner Award, supported principally through the generosity of the Brenner family, is given annually in memory of PCS student Dani Brenner (1978-1995) to a member of the junior class for excellence in creative and expository writing.

### THE GLADYS BROOKS FOUNDATION ENDOWMENT GRANT FOR THE LIBRARY (ESTABLISHED IN 1997)

This endowed fund supports the technological components of the PCS Library, allowing students access to the wide range of modern research resources.

### THE DR. JAMES DAWSON FUND FOR BROADWAY SCHOLARS (ESTABLISHED IN 2014)

The Dr. James Dawson Fund for Broadway Scholars was created in honor and recognition of Dr. Dawson's twentieth anniversary as Head of School. The Fund will provide tuition assistance to students from the Broadway community who, without additional support, would be unable to afford a PCS education.

### THE EDWARD E. FORD FOUNDATION YOUNG DREAMERS FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2008) AND THE EDWARD E. FORD FOUNDATION ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FUND (ESTABLISHED 1973, ADDITIONAL GRANT IN 1990)

These endowed funds provide tuition assistance for outstanding students in good standing with financial need.

### FACULTY SALARY ENDOWMENT (ESTABLISHED WITH AN EDWARD E. FORD FOUNDATION GRANT IN 1981)

This endowed fund supplements faculty salaries, helping to keep them competitive with other independent schools. It allows the school to keep tuition at a reasonable rate while continuing to maintain an excellent professional staff.

### FACULTY ENRICHMENT FUND (ESTABLISHED WITH AN EDWARD E. FORD FOUNDATION GRANT IN 1987)

This fund provides grants for faculty members to attend special workshops, seminars, and embark on special projects of their own design in order to further professional and personal growth.

### FACULTY-STAFF TRAVEL GRANT FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2001)

Two grants annually are awarded to members of the full-time faculty and/or staff who have been continuously employed at PCS for a minimum of four years. Grants can be used for any purpose involving travel within the United States and/or international destinations. The grant program is designed to support travel to fulfill a personal or professional goal, and recipients are selected at the discretion of the Head of School.

#### PETER GLENVILLE THEATRE FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2003)

Established by a generous grant by the Peter Glenville Foundation, this fund provides ongoing operating support for PCS's Peter Glenville Theatre.

### THE JACKSON FAMILY FUND FOR STUDENT SUPPORT (ESTABLISHED IN 2006)

This fund was created by PCS alumna and past Chairman Denise Jackson Sutherland '69, in memory of her parents Audrey Keppel Jackson '39 and John Henry Jackson '35. The fund supports student needs not covered by tuition assistance. Income from the fund provides for the purchase of books, transportation to and from school, eyeglasses, class trips, and other expenses beyond the reach of students with financial need.

### THE CAROL KLEBAN TUITION ASSISTANCE FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2013)

This fund was initially created in 2013 in honor of Carol Kleban's retirement from her position as Associate Head of School. ### THE ROBERT J. MARIANO '61 MEMORIAL FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2003)

Robert Mariano was the director of the first "All of Us" musical in 1960, with fellow students Marvin Hamlisch, Leslie Uggams, Christopher and Glen Walken and Lorin Hollander. The show evolved over the years into the annual Spring Benefit. In 2003, his many classmates and friends established this memorial fund to help support the building and operation of the Peter Glenville Theatre at PCS.

### THE READERS DIGEST-DEWITT WALLACE ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS (ESTABLISHED IN 1992)

This fund provides tuition assistance for students with financial need.

#### THE LAVINIA REESE FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2009)
