While most of us think of Professional Children's School as the school that supports young artists, athletes, and entrepreneurs through their middle and high school years, it is, in fact, much more than that. While many of our alumni do go on to careers in the areas in which they trained while at PCS, the truth is that many also go on to be community and business leaders. This is what sets Professional Children's School apart from all other schools; not only does PCS provide the flexibility that our students need to pursue their dreams, but it also provides the excellent college preparatory education that prepares our students for whatever

their ultimate life and career choices may be. PCS serves the dual purposes of ensuring academic strength as well as the social and emotional growth that a supportive school environment must engender in order for children to thrive.

Kennedy Children's Action Corps, as Vice Chair of the Board for Think of Us, and as

FROM DIRECTOR OF INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT CHRIS

We are profoundly grateful to the hundreds of parents, grandparents, alumni, trustees, faculty, staff, administrators, foundations, and friends who generously contributed \$1.044 million to Professional Children's School during the 2016-2017 school year.

As you may know, financial aid continues to be our greatest need at PCS, and this was another record-breaking year as for gifts toward financial aid and scholarships, with over \$466,000 donated to our growing family of financial aid funds.

THE IMPACT OF DONOR SUPPORT

Professional Children's School is pleased to report on the powerful impact of donor support during the 2016-2017 school year.



SECOND CENTURY STEM INITIATIVE

Generous contributors have invested more than \$300,000 toward PCS's Second Century STEM Initiative (SCSI). The SCSI was created in 2014 to strengthen and deepen our academic offerings in the areas of science, technology, engineering, and math in ways that benefit all students regardless of their current or future careers.

The Second Century STEM Initiative is focused on the following five areas:

- 1. Faculty Professional Development
- 2. Classroom Equipment Upgrades
- 3. Beyond the Classroom Enrichment for Students
- 4. Investment in Technology
- 5. Distinguished Visitor Series

As of the summer of 2017, PCS has invested more than \$88,000 toward state of the art classroom and laboratory equipment and technology upgrades that are benefitting students of all grades.

Additionally, PCS has invested nearly \$44,000 for our STEM faculty to attend national and regional conferences and other trainings to expand and enhance their knowledge base for classroom instruction.

We have invested an additional \$2,000 toward subscriptions for STEM-related scholarly publications and faculty participation in professional associations.

We have also invested \$9,000 toward the implementation of a Distinguished Visitors program. In academic year 2016-2017, three distinguished guest speakers join us in the classroom to discuss coding and its use in designing software, gas laws, scuba diving, and engineering



design in bridge building. For our larger community, including students, faculty, and parents, we invited Dr. Larry Rosen to speak on the topic of Technology, Addiction, and the Changing Ancient Brain. Dr. Rosen is Professor Emeritus of Psychology at California State University, Dominguez Hills, and he is recognized as an international expert in the "Psychology of Technology." For broader dissemination, we simulcast his keynote address and his meeting with our parents. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive from those who attended or viewed the webcast.


In the coming year, we intend to broaden the "beyond the classroom" concept to include bringing in exhibits, workshops, and other outside resources to enrich our students' STEM experience at PCS.

FINANCIAL AID SUPPORT

The need for additional Financial Aid funding continues to grow. In 2016-2017, Professional Children's School awarded \$1.54 million in financial aid to deserving students. Generous gifts to The Dr. James Dawson Fund for Broadway Scholars, the SAPAR Contemporary Art Scholarship Fund, the Nancy Malone Scholarship Fund,



the Carol Kleban Financial Aid Fund, and the PCS Financial Aid Fund have enabled PCS to provide this unprecedented level of funding. Nearly 40 percent of our students in 2016-2017 benefited directly from your philanthropic support of our financial aid funds.



SENIOR CLASS GIFT FUND

This year's Senior Class Gift created a Student Activity Fund, which will support students' attendance at various activities outside of school. This new fund will facilitate student participation in theatrical performances, concerts, athletic events, art and museum programs, and other activities that are ancillary to our academic program, but supportive of our overall goals.

We are grateful to senior class parents Catherine Gropper (mother of Greg) and Robin Louie (mother of Derek) for chairing this year's appeal. The 2017 Senior Class Gift appeal exceeded its goal of \$45,000, raising enough to fully fund the initiative for the next three academic years.




ANNUAL PCS BOAT CRUISE

SHARI HONIG

For over a century, Professional Children's School (PCS) has provided a way for students to pursue their dreams without sacrificing their education. No one knows this better than our current Director of Admissions, Shari Honig. As an alumna, former PCS teacher, academic advisor, and member of our administrative team, Shari is able to see PCS from multiple perspectives.

Q: WHAT BROUGHT YOU TO PCS?

A: Like many of our students. I came to New York to dance the summer before my 10th grade year, and I was invited to participate in a year-round program. I knew I would need to continue my education and had heard about PCS through some of the other dancers. Years later, after becoming an educator, I reached out to Carol Kleban (former Associate Head of School and Alumni Liaison). In 2002, I started at PCS as a maternity leave substitute and ended up staying for eleven years as the ESL teacher and International Student Advisor. I moved to my current position when former Admissions Director Sherrie Hinkle retired. I was interested in helping to shape the culture and future of our school. It's funny, PCS was never a part of my "plan," but I've been here for over 15 years now!

Q: WHAT MAKES PCS UNIQUE FROM OTHER INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS?

A: I think our school is defined by who our students are and the passions they are pursuing outside of school. Our students come to us from all around the world, public schools, independent schools, and a variety of socioeconomic and cultural backgrounds. In addition to our challenging and engaging academics, we offer our students flexibility in scheduling and course selection, as well as a supportive community. Our students, faculty, staff and administrators all share a common passion for what they do and support the mission of the school.

Q: WHAT IS A TYPICAL DAY FOR YOU AT PCS?

A: There isn't really a typical day at PCS, which is what makes this job so much fun! The nature of our school is such that we have to be ready for what each new day

will bring. Generally speaking, my days are filled with meeting new families, guiding school tours, discussing our academic program and reaching out to arts and athletic institutions around the city whose students may benefit from a school like ours. I'm also an academic advisor, so there's a little bit of everything.

Q: HOW HAS BEING AN ALUMNA HELPED YOU IN YOUR CURRENT POSITION AT PCS?

A: I think I'm able to offer an insider's perspective from my life as a student and teacher at PCS as well as from my personal experience with the admissions process. I'm able to honestly discuss the ways in which PCS has evolved over the years, and to reassure families that their children will be viewed as individuals here.

Q: WHAT HAS SURPRISED YOU MOST ABOUT WORKING AT PCS?

A: What is interesting to me is the variety of students applying to our school now. We started off with actors, dancers, musicians, and now we have students who are rock climbers, DJ/ producers, tech entrepreneurs, and many more! I've also noticed that our dancers are coming to us from so many different programs around the city. We have more than ten different dance institutions represented by our PCS students.

Q: WHAT DO YOU WISH OTHER PEOPLE KNEW ABOUT PCS?

A: I try to clarify for people what "professional" means. We have a range of students here—pre-professional, professional, and students who are arts-affiliated. I've also come to realize that PCS students may seem different because they have an intense focus on their craft; however, they are facing many of the same

challenges that all young people face. I'm proud to say, we allow students to pursue their dreams while not being defined by them.

Q: WHAT IS YOUR BEST MEMORY OF PCS?

A: Each year I'm lucky enough to have two events that stand out in my mind. In the fall, we welcome our entire student body and their families to attend a boat cruise around the city; I love seeing the new families who aren't from New York City pass by the Statue of Liberty for the first time. Then at the end of the year, the admissions office hosts a reception for the next group of incoming families, and I think that event bookends the year nicely. I can't forget to mention that some of my favorite teachers from my time as a student here are still teaching at PCS (Shellie Sclan, Mark Savage), so every day for me is a walk down memory lane.

PCS YOUNG ALUMNI

Dr. James Dawson and Dania Nauholnyk, along with several PCS staff and faculty greeted alumni from 2012-2016. The group was served a special lunch prepared by our own kitchen staff in the Peter Glenville Theatre mezzanine.

NAMED & RESTRICTED FUNDS

THE BOB AVIAN SCHOLARSHIP (ESTABLISHED IN 1997)

Sir Cameron Macintosh established this endowed scholarship fund to honor his friend and colleague, producer/choreographer Bob Avian. The scholarship is awarded to a PCS student with an interest in the field of dance and is based on academic and artistic merit.

CENTENNIAL FUND FOR THE FUTURE (ESTABLISHED IN 2012)

The Centennial Fund for the Future was created by the PCS Board of Trustees to raise funds toward paying off the School's IDA Bond.

THE DANI BRENNER '96 DARE TO DREAM FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2010)

The Dani Brenner Award, supported principally through the generosity of the Brenner family, is given annually in memory of PCS student Dani Brenner (1978-1995) to a member of the junior class for excellence in creative and expository writing.

THE GLADYS BROOKS FOUNDATION ENDOWMENT GRANT FOR THE LIBRARY (ESTABLISHED IN 1997)

This endowed fund supports the technological components of the PCS Library, allowing students access to the wide range of modern research resources.

THE DR. JAMES DAWSON FUND FOR BROADWAY SCHOLARS (ESTABLISHED IN 2014)

The Dr. James Dawson Fund for Broadway Scholars was created in honor and recognition of Dr. Dawson's twentieth anniversary as Head of School. The Fund will provide tuition assistance to students from the Broadway community who, without additional support, would be unable to afford a PCS education.

THE EDWARD E. FORD FOUNDATION YOUNG DREAMERS FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2008) AND THE EDWARD E. FORD FOUNDATION ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FUND (ESTABLISHED 1973, ADDITIONAL GRANT IN 1990)

These endowed funds provide tuition assistance for outstanding students in good standing with financial need.

FACULTY SALARY ENDOWMENT (ESTABLISHED WITH AN EDWARD E. FORD FOUNDATION GRANT IN 1981)

This endowed fund supplements faculty salaries, helping to keep them competitive with other independent schools. It allows the school to keep tuition at a reasonable rate while continuing to maintain an excellent professional staff.

FACULTY ENRICHMENT FUND (ESTABLISHED WITH AN EDWARD E. FORD FOUNDATION GRANT IN 1987)

This fund provides grants for faculty members to attend special workshops, seminars, and embark on special projects of their own design in order to further professional and personal growth.

FACULTY-STAFF TRAVEL GRANT FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2001)

Two grants annually are awarded to members of the full-time faculty and/or staff who have been continuously employed at PCS for a minimum of four years. Grants can be used for any purpose involving travel within the United States and/or international destinations. The grant program is designed to support travel to fulfill a personal or professional goal, and recipients are selected at the discretion of the Head of School.

PETER GLENVILLE THEATRE FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2003)

Established by a generous grant by the Peter Glenville Foundation, this fund provides ongoing operating support for PCS's Peter Glenville Theatre.

THE JACKSON FAMILY FUND FOR STUDENT SUPPORT (ESTABLISHED IN 2006)

This fund was created by PCS alumna and past Chairman Denise Jackson Sutherland '69, in memory of her parents Audrey Keppel Jackson '39 and John Henry Jackson '35. The fund supports student needs not covered by tuition assistance. Income from the fund provides for the purchase of books, transportation to and from school, eyeglasses, class trips, and other expenses beyond the reach of students with financial need.

THE CAROL KLEBAN FINANCIAL AID FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2013)

This fund was initially created in 2013 in honor of Carol Kleban's retirement from her position as Associate Head of School. Upon Ms. Kleban's untimely passing in June 2015, the Fund was rededicated to commemorate her life and career in recognition of her more than three decades of service to the PCS community.

THE NANCY MALONE '54 SCHOLARSHIP FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2013)

Established by alumna Nancy Malone to provide scholarship support to PCS students working in the dramatic arts.

THE ROBERT J. MARIANO '61 MEMORIAL FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2003)

Robert Mariano was the director of the first "All of Us" musical in 1960, with fellow students Marvin Hamlisch, Leslie Uggams, Christopher and Glen Walken and Lorin Hollander. The show evolved over the years into the annual Spring Benefit. In 2003, his many classmates and friends established this memorial fund to help support the building and operation of the Peter Glenville Theatre at PCS.

THE READERS DIGEST-DEWITT WALLACE ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS (ESTABLISHED IN 1992)

This fund provides tuition assistance for students with financial need.

THE LAVINIA REESE FUND (ESTABLISHED IN 2009)

An endowed fund providing need-based tuition assistance for PCS's African-American students was established with a bequest in December 2009 from Lavinia Reese. Ms. Reese was an employee of the School for more than 34 years until her retirement as business manager in November 2005.

THE SAPAR CONTEMPORARY ART SCHOLARSHIP (ESTABLISHED IN 2015)

The SAPAR Contemporary Art Scholarship was established to provide tuition support to a talented visual art student(s) who could not otherwise afford a PCS education.

The Second Century STEM Initiative Fund was created to strengthen and deepen PCS's academic offerings in the areas of science, math, and technology in ways that benefit all students regardless of their possible careers.


