FROM THE OFFICE OF INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT

It is no surprise that the past two years have been challenging for schools like ours. New York City comprises over 200 independent schools, and we are lucky and grateful to count ourselves among this resilient community. The 2021-2022 school year marked the return to many of our long-held traditions, and this year's Annual Report on Giving will represent the many people who have contributed to our continued success during these extraordinary times.

An unprecedented 46% of PCS students received financial assistance this past school year, highlighting the growing need for support among families and our continued desire to create accessible pathways to a flexible education. The young people who come through our doors are bursting with creativity, drive, and compassion, and this year brought us together again with a refreshed vision for the future of Professional Children's School.

The theme for the 2021-2022 report is rebuilding, and this year we laid the foundation for the next chapter of PCS. We reflect on our history, filled with over a century of memories of talented young people building their dreams, and we move forward with dreams of our own. This year we focused on rebuilding our school spirit, rebuilding our community, and rebuilding our promise to serve remarkable young people bravely embarking on their professional journeys.

The 2021-2022 school year began with an extraordinary anonymous gift of \$1,000,000,

establishing an endowed financial aid fund in support of future generations of PCS students. This generous gift will have a lasting impact on our school's legacy, enabling more students to benefit from a PCS education.

In September 2021, we proudly welcomed PCS families and students to the Annual Circle Line Boat Cruise, our first since before the pandemic, kicking off the school year with a fun-filled celebration on the Hudson. We are grateful to our Board of Trustees for underwriting this event, ensuring that all PCS families could attend at no cost.

In November 2021, with the support of over 170 donors, we raised \$210,000 on our annual Day of Giving. We were deeply humbled by the record-breaking support on this day, and we thank our entire community for participating!

In April 2022, we celebrated the return of our in-person Spring Gala, hosted on the Rooftop at Edison Ballroom with an open-air dining experience in the heart of Times Square.

We are grateful for the many attendees and supporters who joined us in honoring alumni Anthony Roth Costanzo '00 and Samuel Akins '14 with the PCS Legacy Award, and for those who were able to join in-person or online in cheering on our incredible student performers.

In May 2022, we launched a Spring Matching Gift Challenge. We express our deepest gratitude to the Board of Trustees for their generous

matching gift of \$70,000, and to the many contributors this spring who helped us meet the match and reach our goal of \$140,000.

In June 2022, we welcomed PCS alumni to the Peter Glenville Theatre for our first Alumni Reunion in over 5 years. It was such a special experience to be "together again", and we look forward to many future in-person gatherings.

Together, we raised \$2.05 million for Professional Children's School between July 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022. We are profoundly grateful to our entire community of supporters for moving us forward, and we hope you enjoy this year's Annual Report on Giving.

FROM HEAD OF SCHOOL

DR. JAMES DAWSON

Ralph Waldo Emerson once wrote, "What lies behind us and what lies before us are tiny matters compared to what lies within us." There is certainly much more to say about these past two years, filled with the challenges of time wrought about by the COVID pandemic and exacerbated by the seemingly universal crisis of the spirit, moments of uncertainty and discomfort, and a global culture so filled with rancor and divisiveness. These have been tough times, where we saw the arts and competitive athletics pummeled and diminished and we felt the broader impact at our very core: it is hard to imagine a school for professional children when so many of the professions that brought young people to us were on hold or shut down or on hiatus. A challenging time, indeed.

It is with my deepest sense of gratitude and appreciation that I extend my sincere thanks to all of those whose names appear within this year's annual report; each of you and all of you have provided incredible levels of support during a time when things were tough, when the chips were down, when the arts were on hold, when the dreams were pushed back upon. You believed in what we do and in the young people we support, and your belief and your conviction


empower us to move on, to rebuild, to rekindle, to rise with the dawn and to walk together into a calmer, and hopefully more fruitful future.

We are not quite finished with the challenges brought upon us by these past two years, but we are well started on the process to rebuild. The past academic year was one of the more challenging years in recent PCS history, however we are cautiously optimistic and even confident that the worst is behind us. Student enrollment remained down nearly 40% from pre-pandemic levels as COVID-19 continued to impact us, presenting unprecedented challenges for students and their families, faculty and staff. We are hopeful that the 2022-2023 school year will be calmer, steadier and will allow our entire community the visibility needed in order to reset and rebuild. As we navigate the world in this "new normal", the Board of Trustees, Administration and our incredible staff, remain as committed as ever to shepherding this extraordinary institution to the other side of this mountain. We are fortunate that the school remains on firm financial footing, in part due to our ability to utilize the PCS endowment "reserve" funds to bridge a budget gap caused by our lower enrollment numbers.

The start of the 2022-2023 school year is a good time to focus on the goals for the year ahead. At PCS, we have already surpassed new student enrollment over last year and our admissions season is expected to continue strongly throughout not only the early fall but also for second semester as well. We will welcome new faculty members who bring fresh perspectives as well as new Trustees reflecting added diversity, strong engagement and vast networks of people who support our mission. We look forward and see a clear vision of Professional Children's School's mission: to provide a rigorous, high quality education while supporting our students in their various professional endeavors. Our dedicated faculty and staff understand the challenges our students face as they pursue careers in their chosen field, and they work tirelessly to help prepare our students for their futures, both educational and beyond. It is the hard work and dedication of the faculty and staff and the leadership of Head of School Dr. James Dawson and his team, as well as our culture of collaboration and acceptance of all that helps make PCS such a special place.

This past April, PCS was able to host our annual gala in person for the first time in three years. Being together again to celebrate the school was meaningful for everyone who attended, especially for students who performed so beautifully at the event. Our generous donors contributed over \$190,000, far surpassing our fundraising goals! The proceeds provided crucial support for the school's Financial Aid Fund, a vehicle we

cannot live without given that 46% of students receive some level of financial aid. Overall, the total number of donors that supported the school this past year increased 16% from the prior year. This increase is deeply meaningful to the Board of Trustees and vital to PCS. Our donors are the lifeblood of our fundraising efforts and we share our profound thanks for your continued support.

As Chair of the Board of Trustees, and a proud alumna of the PCS class of 1991, I'm looking forward to a year that will allow us to restore and rebuild our community. I'm grateful that PCS has an experienced and passionate leader in Dr. Dawson. His steady hand, experience and wisdom continue to guide us forward. The Board of Trustees is proud that the financial standing of the school remains strong and we are incredibly grateful to each of you for your support of PCS. Your commitment and enthusiasm enables Professional Children's School to fulfill our unique educational mission as we plan for this school year and for future generations of talented, eager and bright PCS students.




ANTHONY ROTH COSTANZO '00 AND SAMUEL AKINS '14.



Anthony Roth Costanzo '00

Countertenor Anthony Roth Costanzo, who attended PCS from grades 8 through 12, began performing professionally at the age of 11 and has since appeared in opera, concert, recital, film, and on Broadway. He is a GRAMMY winner, a recipient of the 2020 Beverly Sills Award from the Metropolitan Opera, a winner of the 2020 Opera News Award, and Musical America's 2019 Vocalist of the Year. Costanzo has appeared with

many of the world's leading opera houses including the Metropolitan Opera, San Francisco Opera, English National Opera, Opera Philadelphia, Glyndebourne Opera Festival, Dallas Opera, Teatro Real Madrid, and Finnish National Opera. In concert he has sung with the New York Philharmonic. The Cleveland Orchestra. National Symphony Orchestra, San Francisco Symphony, Berlin Philharmonic, NDR at the Elbphilharmonie in Hamburg, and the London Symphony Orchestra, among others.



Samuel Akins '14

Ballet dancer Samuel Akins, who attended PCS from grades 10 through 12, started his ballet training in Birmingham, Alabama, at the Alabama School of Fine Arts. Akins moved to New York at 14 years old to continue his training with the School of American Ballet, while pursuing academics at PCS. After graduating from SAB and PCS, Akins went on to dance with the Los Angeles Ballet and the Alabama Ballet. Akins later moved to Australia where he struggled

to find work as a Black ballet dancer. Out of frustration and necessity for change in 2021, Akins co-founded the advocacy organization "Diverse Dancers Australia" through which he advocates for greater equity, diversity, and inclusion on a national level. Currently, Akins lives in Paris and dances with L'Opera National de Paris.



DIVERSITY, EQUITY, & INCLUSION

With thanks to our Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee - composed of faculty, staff, administrators, and students - we are pleased to share the many developments and successes in Professional Children's School's efforts to create a more supportive and inclusive environment.

In the 2021-2022 school year, the DEI Committee met monthly to discuss and strategize for improved efforts within our school community. This year's meetings included student voices and leadership. PCS continued to host the social justice student group Together We Rise and the newly named Gender and Sexuality Alliance which met weekly, and added a Racial Affinity Group for anyone who identifies as a person of color. Students and the PCS professional community sought to celebrate groups and cultures by creating interactive and informative displays around the school building, by sharing digital communications, and also creating video content and presentations for weekly school-wide Community Meetings. Additionally, we continued the annual MLK Assembly, with videos, poetry, and speakers honoring the impact of Martin Luther King, Jr. and the Civil Rights Movement, and highlighting ongoing social justice work in the world.

Over the past few years, PCS has issued statements in support of Black Lives Matter and Stop Asian Hate. This year, the committee added an "Inappropriate Language and Hate Speech Statement", which was approved by the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees continues to support growing DEI initiatives at PCS, and includes Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion as an agenda item on all meetings. Additionally, the academic team has started the process for an intensive curriculum review. In an effort to bring in more diverse perspectives and increased representation, the school's library and curriculum will undergo an ongoing assessment.

We are proud of the continued work of the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee and the many voices that contribute to building a safe, supportive environment at PCS.



(established in 2021)

This endowed financial aid fund was created to expand the possibility of a PCS education to a broader, more diverse population.

THE BOB AVIAN SCHOLARSHIP

(established in 1997)

Sir Cameron Macintosh established this endowed scholarship fund to honor his friend and colleague, producer/choreographer Bob Avian. The scholarship is awarded to a PCS student with an interest in the field of dance and is based on academic and artistic merit.

CENTENNIAL FUND FOR THE FUTURE

(established in 2012)

The Centennial Fund for the Future was created by the PCS Board of Trustees to raise funds toward paying off the School's IDA Bond.

THE DANI BRENNER '96 DARE TO DREAM FUND

(established in 2010)

FACULTY SALARY ENDOWMENT

(established with an Edward E. Ford Foundation grant in 1981)

This endowed fund supplements faculty salaries, helping to keep them competitive with other independent schools. It allows the school to keep tuition at a reasonable rate while continuing to maintain an excellent professional staff.

FACULTY ENRICHMENT FUND

(established with an Edward E. Ford Foundation grant in 1987)

This fund provides grants for faculty members to attend special workshops, seminars, and embark on special projects of their own design in order to further professional and personal growth.

FACULTY-STAFF TRAVEL GRANT FUND

(established in 2001)

Grants can be used for any purpose involving travel within the United States and/or international destinations. The grant program is designed to support travel to fulfill a personal or professional goal, and recipients are selected at the discretion of the Head of School.

PETER GLENVILLE THEATRE FUND

(established in 2003)

Established by a generous grant by the Peter Glenville Foundation, this fund provides ongoing operating support for PCS's Peter Glenville Theatre.

THE JACKSON FAMILY FUND FOR STUDENT SUPPORT

(established in 2006)

This fund was created by PCS alumna and past Chairman Denise Jackson Sutherland '69, in memory of her parents Audrey Keppel Jackson '39 and John Henry Jackson '35.
